

When John and Colleen Purrier went shopping for a new house in 1995, they didn't care about the number of bedrooms. "We just kept asking for a really *big* basement," says Colleen with a laugh. "We wanted a place for our books and we bought this home just to make a book room."

Autumn Donovan, ASID, interior designer at Tenhulzen Remodeling in Redmond, Washington, says the renovation of the basement in the 1927 Seattle home took about four months and involved completely redoing the plumbing, removing posts and support beams and replacing the entire staircase.
